



Summer Solstice


This year National Indigenous People's Day falls upon Summer Solstice

The structure will be very similar to our beginner classes along with basic pronunciation, grammar rules, and some vocabulary.







Sewing Machine Basics Teaching Workshop for Youth Females Ages 12-18 years old Wed., July 7, 2021 | 6:00 PM @ Health


Want to sew but don't know how?


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
