SUMMARY OF POSITION:

Reporting to the Fire Keeper Patrol Coordinator, the Fire Keeper Patrol Worker is responsible for providing culturally appropriate crisis counselling and case management services. The incumbent will be focused on supporting urban Indigenous members experiencing homelessness, substance abuse/addiction, and mental health issues. The Fire Keeper Patrol Worker will create linkages to necessary external and internal supports and programs. The incumbent will ensure all services are trauma-informed, based on a harm reduction model and culturally responsive to produce positive outcomes for members. The Fire Keeper Patrol Worker will work as a team to support the urban mobile outreach program: Fire Keeper Patrol. The position works collaboratively with community service providers, and volunteers.
