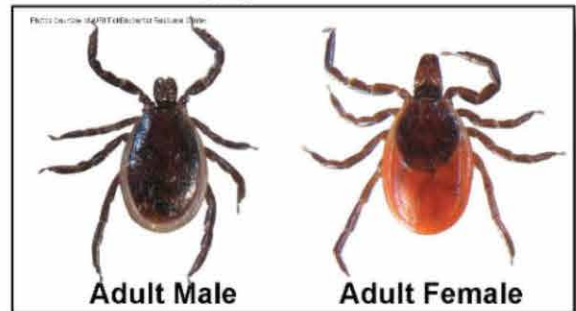


American Dog Tick



does **Not** transmit Lyme disease

Blacklegged Tick (Deer Tick)



can transmit Lyme disease

Ticks have been found on the reserve.

Chapleau is not considered to be a high-risk area for tick-borne illnesses such as Lyme disease or Anaplasmosis, which can be carried by Blacklegged ticks.

However, ticks can be transported by migratory birds and can be encountered anywhere there is a habitat for them.

Long grass and weeds are an ideal habitat for ticks.

To help discourage ticks from being on your property, do the following:

- **Mow the lawn regularly.**
- Remove leaf litter, brush and weeds.
- Keep tree branches and shrubs trimmed to let in more sunlight.

For all rental units except Mukeso House, tenants are responsible for grass cutting.

To help prevent tick bites, do the following:

- Wear light coloured clothing so ticks are easier to spot.
- Keep covered with long pants and a long-sleeved shirt.
- Wear closed footwear, socks, and tuck your pants into your socks.
- Use a tick repellent that has "DEET" (follow the manufacturer's directions).
- Put a tick and flea collar on your pets, and check them for ticks periodically.
- Search your body well for ticks after being in grass or bushy areas. Pay special attention to groin, scalp, and armpits. Use a mirror to check your back.
